Stipulations for Disposal Site: Citrus fruit, culls, pulp, peel, seeds, leaves, twigs, limbs, soil and plant debris must be disposed of in locations that will not pose a risk to commercial citrus groves or nurseries. No pastures will be approved for dumping any Citrus Black Spot (CBS) Quarantine waste material. Any site approved for dumping non-quarantine citrus waste as feed requires livestock to be present in a fenced and gated pasture with no citrus trees or sprouts. An inspector must conduct an initial survey to verify the property meets the requirements of Chapter 581, F.S., and 5B-63.001, F.A.C., and must re-inspect at least annually thereafter. This permit is issued on a temporary basis only. The designated destination must be located a minimum of one mile from any citrus nursery, and at least 1900 feet from the nearest citrus tree retailer, feral or dooryard citrus trees, or citrus groves in locations outside CBS Quarantine Areas. A buffer distance of less than 1900 feet is not allowed. Any request for an exception must be sent in writing to the Division Director requesting a scientific risk assessment.
