Section 7: Transfer Endorsement (wild caught Iguana iguana only)

Applicants interested in transferring wild caught live green iguanas to individuals authorized to sell green iguanas may opt to add a transfer endorsement to their Eradication and Control of Nonnative Species permit. Facilities meet the caging and biosecurity standards set forth in Chapter 68-5 and 68A-6, F.A.C., for possessing Prohibited species. This transfer endorsement will not be issued until an inspection of the facility housing green iguanas is completed and meets requirements in rule. Green iguanas do not need to be PIT tagged unless kept in the permitted facility for more than 30 days.

I understand that representatives of the FWC Division of Law Enforcement will need to conduct an inspection of the facilities and caging used to contain green iguana prior to issuance of this endorsement.

I understand that green iguanas over 5" snout-vent-length must be PIT tagged if kept at the facility for more than 30 days.

I would like to apply for a transfer endorsement to my Eradication and Control permit.
