Section 1003.42(2)(g)1., F.S.:

- □ The history of the Holocaust (1933-1945).
- □ The systematic and planned annihilation of European Jews and other groups by Nazi Germany.
- A watershed event in the history of humanity, taught in a manner that leads to an investigation of human behavior.
- An understanding of the ramifications of prejudice, racism and stereotyping.
- □ An examination of what it means to be a responsible and respectful person, for the purposes of encouraging tolerance of diversity in a pluralistic society and for nurturing and protecting democratic values and institutions.
- □ The policy, definition, and historical and current examples of anti-Semitism, as described in section 1000.05(8), F.S.

- □ The history of African peoples before the political conflicts that led to the development of slavery.
- □ The passage to America.
- □ The enslavement experience.

- □ An understanding of the ramifications of prejudice, racism and stereotyping on individual freedoms.
- □ An examination of what it means to be a responsible and respectful person, for the purpose of encouraging tolerance of diversity in a pluralistic society and for nurturing and protecting democratic values and institutions.
- □ The roles and contributions of individuals from all walks of life and their endeavors to learn and thrive throughout history as artists, scientists, educators, businesspeople, influential thinkers, members of the faith community, and political and governmental leaders and the courageous steps they took to fulfill the promise of democracy and unite the nation.
