Scoring Rubric for

General Program Support and Specific Cultural Project Applications

How to use this rubric

Grant panelists will receive a copy of the rubric as a part of their panelist training materials. The rubric will be employed to ensure as fair and unbiased a panel process as possible. The scoring mechanism defines each of the <u>four three</u> criteria scored by panelists:

Quality of Offerings, <u>Reach and Impact</u>, <u>and Track Record</u>, <u>and History and Heritage Promotion</u>. Within each criterion, benchmark descriptions and corresponding point values are listed to serve as a guide in the scoring process.

Grant applicants can use the rubric as a guideline in completing their applications.

Quality of Offerings (Up to 40 35 Points)

The Panelists will consider the-following application information will be considered when evaluating an application for Quality of Offerings: Applicant Mission Statement, Applicant Goals/Objectives/Activities, Programming/Project Description, Partnerships and Collaborations and Required Attachments and Support Materials. Note: An application should not be considered if it indicates lack of compliance with all state and federal laws. This is also the case with regard to the applicants' activities, including non-grant funded activities, that are of such a nature that the applicant would be in violation of Florida Statute Chapter 847 if a minor were to be present.

<u>The Panelists will consider the following application information will be considered</u> when evaluating an application for <u>Reach and Impact</u>: the number of proposed events, opportunities for public participation and counties served; location and reach of the programming/project; estimated number of individuals, youth, <u>elders</u> and artists benefiting; marketing/promotion/publicity plans and audience development/expansion; <u>and programming/project impact narrative</u>; accessibility for all considerations; and physical as well as socioeconomic and geographic accessibility of facilities and programming/project.
